Position Summary

The **Electrician** is responsible for the construction, installation, and maintenance of all lighting equipment and show elements for The Little Theatre On The Square's 2026 Summer Stock season. This position reports directly to the Master Electrician, Technical Director, and Lighting Designer with the needs of the production and works closely with other production and technical staff to ensure the successful execution of all the lighting designs.

Position Responsibilities

Essential functions include, but are not limited to:

- Direct / Daily Supervisor: Technical Director, Master Electrician, Lighting Designer and Production Stage Manager
- Construct, install, and maintain all lighting equipment and elements for productions
- Participate in all load-ins, load-outs, and strikes for each production

- The hanging, cabling, system check / ring out of the lighting rig for the productions, focusing of lights and pre and post show checks of the production.
- Build, install, and modify scenic units as required by design and production needs (light boxes, light up signs, etc...)
- Attend all tech rehearsals
- Electrical wiring of particles, stage effects, and theatrical lighting units
- Leading and working of with skilled and unskilled crew members during change overs
- Maintain and repair house equipment, tools, and theatre stock units
- Assist with cleaning and organization of the lighting booth and workspaces
- Adhere to all LTOTS policies, procedures, and safety protocols
- Operate LTOTS vehicles as required
- Lighting Designer for TYA productions, optional, with additional payment,
- Perform additional duties as assigned by the Technical Director, Executive Director, and production staff, examples including cleaning, changing light bulbs, restocking, and general maintenance

Position Qualifications

- Programing knowledge of ETC Ion Console
- Experience with programing, rigging, hazers, foggers, theatrical effects, soldering, LED tape, intelligent lighting fixtures, wiring particles, balancing electrical loads, and standard theatrical practices
- Aptitude for creative technical and artistic problem solving
- Familiarity with Vectorworks, Lightwright, Google Drive Office Applications
- Good at organizational, interpersonal, time management, and communication skills
- Training and experience in the safe operation of stationary, portable power tools, and hand tools
- Ability to read and interpret technical drawings, working plans, lighting paper work
- Strong time management, multitasking, problem-solving, and communication skills
- Ability to work in a fast-paced, high-energy, and rapidly changing environment
- Ability to work independently and follow direction as part of a team; must be a self-starter

Physical Requirements

- Ability to lift and carry up to 50 pounds
- Ability to stand, bend, climb, and perform physical labor for 8+ hours per day
- Ability to work at heights, including on ladders, 12 feet and up and in elevated positions up to 17 feet
- Valid driver's license with a clean driving record and the ability to be insured under the theatre's vehicle policy

Hiring Preferences

- Bachelor Degree from an accredited University or College, or current enrollment as an upperclassmen
- Or 2-3 years employment of experience in entertainment industry
